

Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Substance Abuse (FUA)

HEDIS® Measurement Year 2023

Measure Description: The percentage of emergency department (ED) visits among members 13 years of age and older with a principal diagnosis of substance use disorder (SUD), or any diagnosis of drug overdose, for which there was follow-up. Two rates are reported:

- 1. The percentage of ED visits for which the member received follow-up within 30 days of the ED visit (31 total days).
- 2. 2. The percentage of ED visits for which the member received follow-up within 7 days of the ED visit (8 total days).

Eligible Population

- Members who are 13 years of age or older on the date of the ED visit with a principal diagnosis of SUD or any diagnosis of drug overdose on or between January 1 and December 1 of the measurement year.
- Members who are in hospice or receiving palliative care are excluded from the eligible population.

Note: Members may have more than one ED visit in the measurement year. If a member has more than one ED visit in a 31-day period, include only the first eligible ED visit.

Measure Compliance - (numerator)

A follow-up visit or a pharmacotherapy dispensing event (two rates are reported)

- within 30 days after the ED visit, including on the date of the ED visit (31 total days).
- within 7 days after the ED visit, including on the date of the ED visit (8 total days).

Measure Compliance (numerator), continued Any of the following meet criteria for a follow-up visit:

- An outpatient, telehealth, observation, or telephone visit with any diagnosis of SUD or with a MH provider
- An e-visit or virtual check-in visit with any diagnosis of SUD or with a MH provider
- A community MH center visit with any diagnosis of SUD or with a MH provider
- An intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization with any diagnosis of SUD or with a MH provider
- A non-residential substance abuse treatment facility visit with any diagnosis of SUD or with a MH provider
- A peer support service with any diagnosis of SUD
- A substance use disorder or substance use service, or opioid treatment service
- A behavioral health screening or assessment for SUD or mental health disorders
- A pharmacotherapy dispensing event or medication treatment event
