

# Use of Imaging Studies for Low Back Pain (LBP)

### HEDIS® Measurement Year 2023

**Measure Description:** Assesses the percentage of members 18-75 years of age with a principal diagnosis of low back pain who did not have an imaging study (plain X-ray, MRI, CT scan) within 28 days of the diagnosis.

**Note:** This measure is reported as an inverted rate. A higher score indicates appropriate treatment of low back pain (i.e., the proportion for whom imaging studies did not occur.)

# Eligible Population

- Commercial, Medicaid and Medicare members 18-75 years of age as of December 31 of the measurement year.
- Members who are in hospice or palliative care are excluded from the eligible population.

#### **Exclusions**

Exclude members who meet any of the following criteria:

- documented evidence of cancer, recent trauma, intravenous drug abuse, neurologic impairment, HIV, spinal infection, major organ transplant, prolonged use of corticosteroids, osteoporosis, fragility fracture, lumbar surgery, or spondylopathy.
- Members 66 years of age and older as of December 31 of the measurement year who have both a frailty and an advanced illness diagnosis.

## **Numerator Codes**
